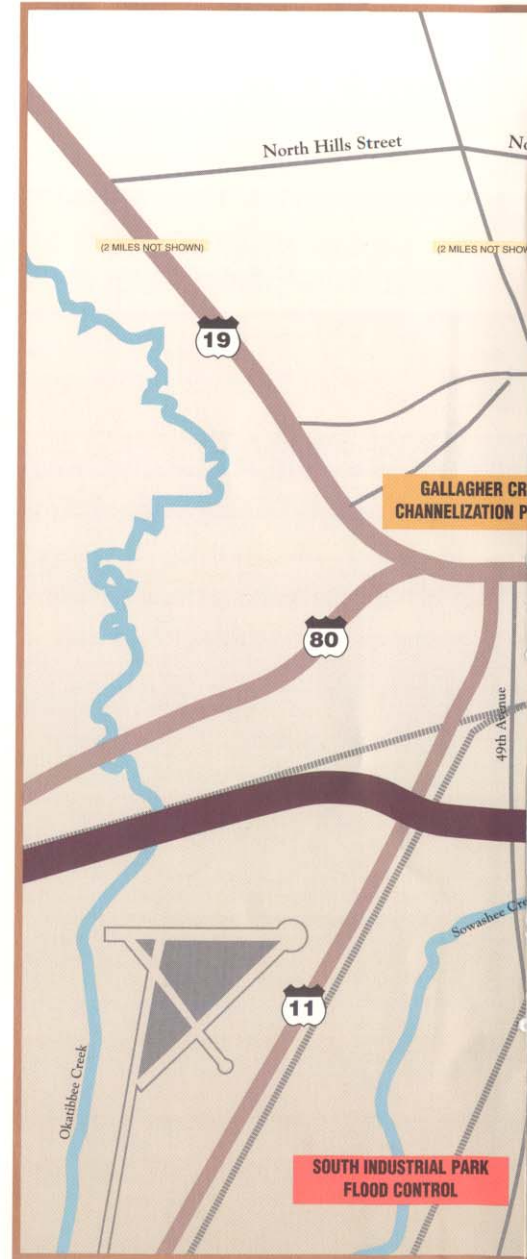
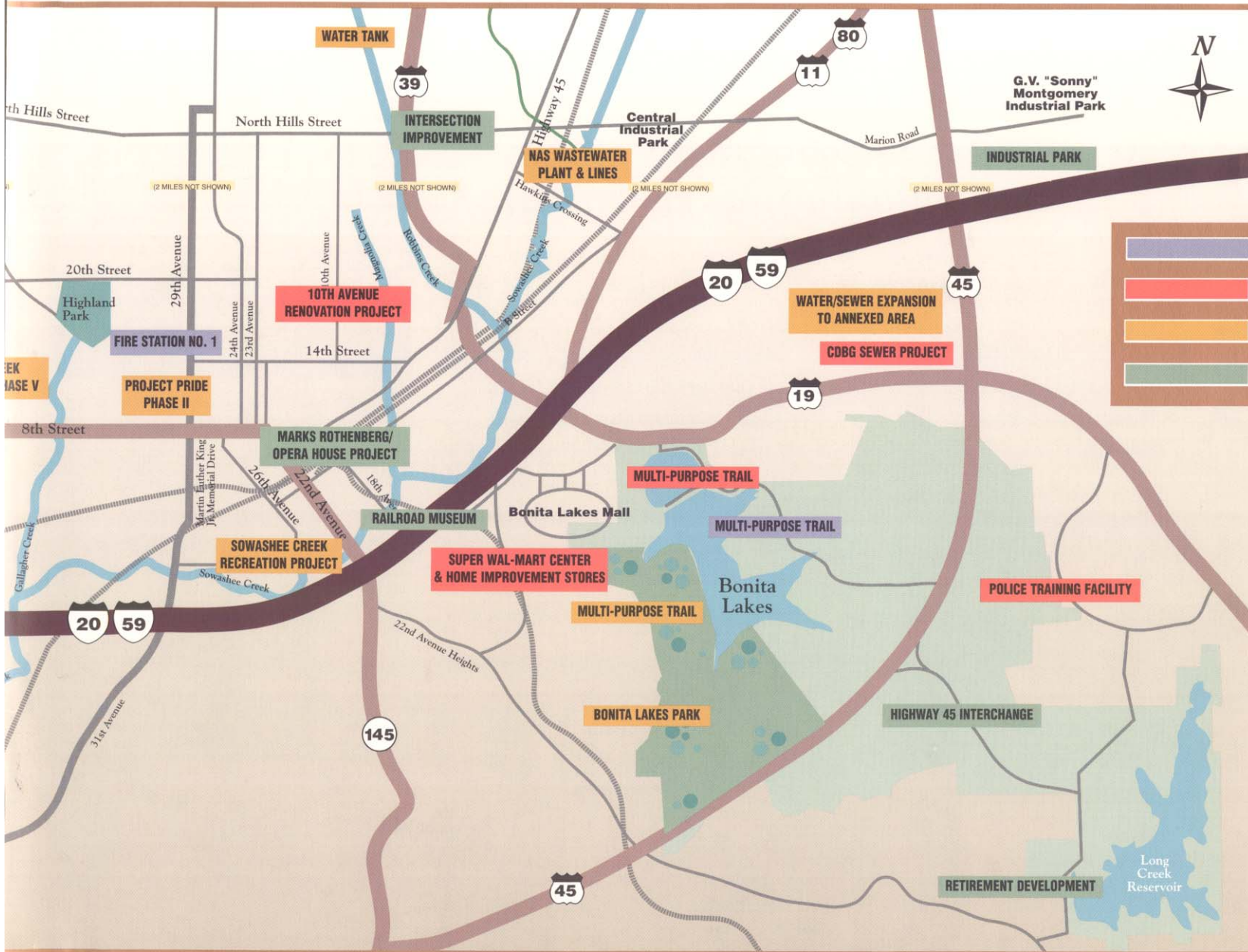


AT LEFT, THE VIEW IN 1900 AS YOU STAND AT THE INTERSECTION OF 4TH STREET AND 22ND AVENUE. MARKS ROTHENBERG (LEFT, COMPLETE WITH CLOCK ON TOP) DOMINATES THE LANDSCAPE. IF YOU LOOK IN THE CENTER OF THE PHOTO, YOU CAN SEE "THREEFOOT BROTHERS & CO." ON THE BUILDING... THEY LATER BUILT MERIDIAN'S ONLY SKYSCRAPER. CITIZENS NATIONAL BANK IS STILL IN THE SAME LOCATION AND THE DUMONT BUILDING (ON LEFT NEXT TO MARKS ROTHENBERG) REVEALS ITS ORIGINAL SPLendor.



AT RIGHT, THE SAME SCENE IN 2000. THE DUMONT BUILDING BURNED TO THE GROUND MANY YEARS AGO; TODAY IT IS THE SITE OF THE DUMONT PLAZA, A DOWNTOWN PARK AND GATHERING PLACE. THE THREEFOOT BUILDING NOW DOMINATES THE SKYLINE. THE MARKS ROTHENBERG BUILDING STILL STANDS AND IS PART OF THE MARKS ROTHENBERG/OPERA HOUSE PROJECT—a \$31 MILLION UNDERTAKING THAT WILL RESTORE THE GRAND OPERA HOUSE AND CREATE AN ARTS EDUCATION AND CONFERENCE CENTER.
